## Precast Fair Application

Applications are due no later than Sunday, October 19, 2025

Gainey's is excited to add our Precast Fair to our 2025 Community Day. The Precast Fair is an opportunity for students to research Precast Concrete for the chance to **win up to \$240 in cash prizes**.

Teams for the Precast Fair can be made up of (1-2) students. In order to participate, students must submit an application with details of the topic they will research. Applications are due Sunday, October 19, 2025, and our Judging Panel will review them. There will be (6) presentations chosen for our Precast Fair. Each team selected to present at the Precast Fair on October 25, 2024, at our Community Day will receive a cash prize of \$40.

Presenters for the Precast Fair must follow the rules listed below. After they are selected, they will need to design a tri-fold board and prepare a (2-5 minute) presentation that they will give to the Judging Panel at Community Day. Students have to research what precast concrete is, career opportunities in the precast industry, and the advantages of precast over other building materials. Presenters will be judged in (4) categories: originality, content coverage, aesthetics, and presentation. The winner of the Precast Fair will win a \$200 cash prize. ### Rules

- Presentations must be the work of the student(s) with minimal help from adults; teachers and parents are to provide only necessary guidance, encouragement, and constructive criticism.
- Students must fill out and submit the application by Sunday, October 19, 2025, in order to be considered to present at the Precast Fair.
- Chosen presenters will receive a cash prize of \$40.
- Presenters will display details of their project on a tri-fold board and give a (2-5 minute) presentation to the Judging Panel on the day of the event.
- Display guidelines
  - Students should have a three-panel backboard display, which can be purchased at a school or office supply store, or you can make your own out of cardboard, styrofoam, etc.
  - Dimensions for the board should not exceed 36" x 48".
  - Display boards should be unique, informative, and aesthetically pleasing.
- Presenters will receive a score of (1-5 points) in (4) categories:
  - Originality
  - Content Coverage (*thorough explanation of all three required topics*)
  - Aesthetics
  - Presentation (2-5 mins)
